Hong Kong Airport to Shanghai Pudong International Airport : HK\$2,300 – 3,500

Shenzhen Paoan Airport to HongQiao Domestic Airport : RMB1,400 – 2,000

Pudong Airport (International arrival)- Taxi is my recommended transportation for first-time visitors. It costs 120 -150 RMB (15~20 USD) to most places in downtown Shanghai. [Airport buses](#) are also available and operate on [6 routines](#). The [Maglev](#) train costs 50 RMB and then available connect to Subway.

HongQiao Airport (China Domestic arrival) - Most people take taxis to leave the airport. Since HongQiao airport is much nearer to the downtown area of the city, the taxi fee is typically less than 100 RMB (12 USD). The terminal building of the HongQiao airport has a "L" shape. The taxi station is at the corner of the "L", outside the Arrival Exit A.
